

No Charges are Filed

It is possible that the District Attorneys' office will decide not to bring any charges against you. Below, you will find a short diagram of how that might happen.

You are arrested or cited.



Decision by the District Attorney (D.A.)

It is extremely important to talk to an attorney during this stage of the case. Just because you have been arrested or cited does not necessarily mean that the District Attorney will file charges against you. In some cases, we have been able to convince the District Attorney not to file any charges by providing them with information that can not be gathered from a simple police report.



No charges are filed

Although you were initially accused of a crime, no charges have been filed against you. It is essentially as if the incident had never taken place.
